



# **2018 All Site Analysis**

HealthTalk Express is a 30 minute or less health presentation using a persuasive public speaking approach, which strives to empower the audience to take action. The Program was designed to raise awareness about chronic disease prevention, with each talk focusing on a chronic condition and a relevant risk-reducing health behavior.

HealthTalk Express offers presentations covering seven health topics: cancer, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, stress management, physical activity, medication safety, and stroke



#### Relevance

In 2018, a total of 1,056 participants attended HealthTalk Express in 14 Texas counties. Table 1 (page 1) describes the *HealthTalk* Express program impact. Listed in the table are the seven presentation topics and mean scores for the five evaluation outcomes.

Table 2 (page 2) details the participants' demographic characteristics through gender, age, ethnicity, and education.




