NETWORK CONCEPT

Support professional development & performance improvement through innovative technologies such as interactive web conferencing & online asynchronous learning modules.

Engage subject matter experts & military helping professionals to identify needs of the caregiving community through formal & informal evaluation.

Educate military helping professionals, service members, & families on issues related to caregiving through quality, reliable programming, listening & responding to their learning needs.

AUDIENCE

Military caregiving, much like caregiving for the population in general, touches many more families than the numbers reflect. Providing support & services for service members, veterans & caregivers is a socioeconomic challenge in the United States, especially among the wounded warrior & special needs populations. The MFLN Military Caregiving concentration area provides educational programs to a variety of military helping professionals that assist family caregivers. Professionals include Case Managers, Social Workers, Licensed Marriage & Family Therapists, Licensed Professional Counselors, Family Support Providers, etc.

VIRTUAL CONFERENCE

3 day online learning event designed to support personal and professional growth in key areas of the Department of Defense, Family Readiness System.

9 sessions addressed topics such as The Family Readiness System & You; What do Networks Mean for My Work?; Creative Visual Language; Holistic Financial Health for Human Services; & Create a Network that Works.
