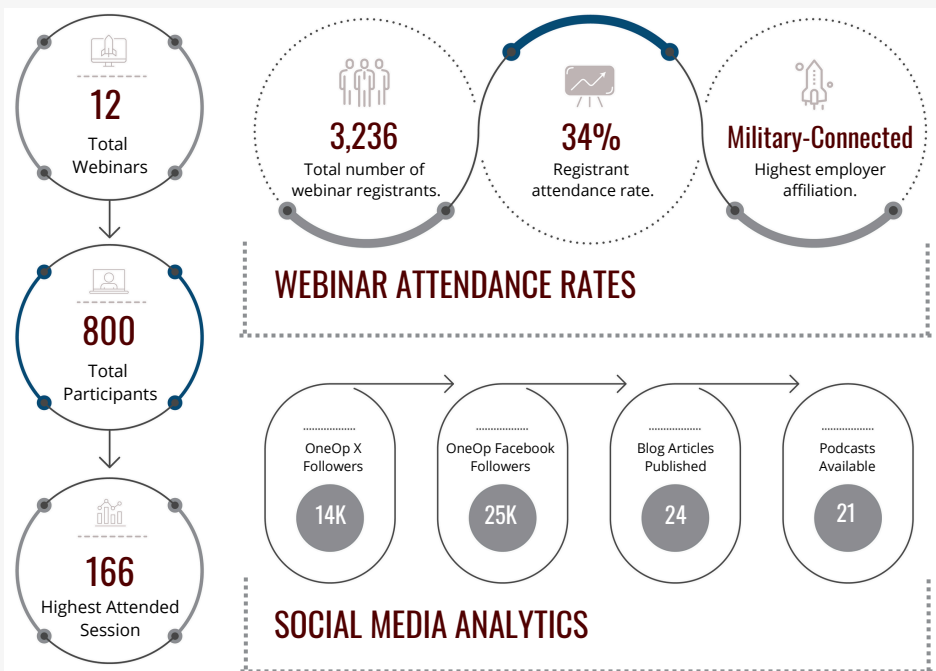

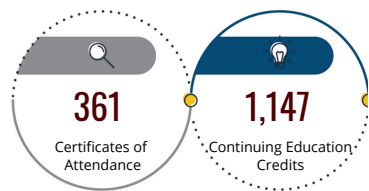


### About

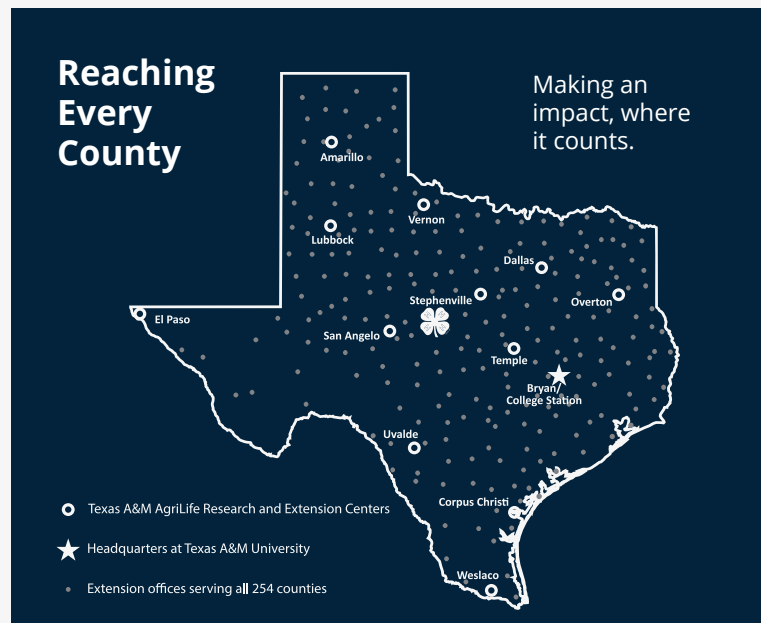
## Family and Community Health
